Haiti needs your prayers & support!

Haiti is in a State of Emergency to confront the worsening security crisis fueled by the growing power of violent armed gangs. 2 were just designated by the US as Foreign Terrorist Organizations (FTOs) and Specially Designated Global Terrorists (SDGTs).

US State Department alert 09/18/2024 & still in effect: Do not travel to Haiti due to **kidnapping**, **crime**, **civil unrest**, and **limited health care**. Crimes involving firearms are common in Haiti. They include robbery, carjackings, sexual assault, and kidnappings for ransom.

It's bad. Our loved ones there have the most generous and kind hearts and long to live in peace and make a difference in their communities, but they face terror and chaos every day.

Many Haitians are here via programs where they are fully documented, law abiding, tax paying & contributing members of our society. It was announced Friday that a long-standing program, **Temporary Protected Status (TPS)**, *will end this August 3, and all deport by September 2*. Even those here since 2010.

From Julie Staven Brouwer's Facebook post of June 30, shared to our page:

TPS was first granted to Haitians in **2010**, after a catastrophic earthquake killed **200,000**+ people and left **1.5 million** homeless—more than a tenth of Haiti's population.

TPS is a legal immigration status.

People under TPS are **not** undocumented or "illegal" Hundreds of thousands of Haitians with TPS have done everything asked of them:

They followed the law. They worked hard. They built lives. They send money back to families struggling in gang-torn Haiti.

They are real people. You may not know their names, but I do. And it's heartbreaking.

From a report by NBC Miami on June 30, a TPS holder was quoted

"I've been kidnapped before and me going to this country and now is even worse than before, that's a fear for my life, you know?" before adding that sending him back to Haiti would be a death sentence.

When asked if he would have a place to live, he said: "No, there's no place to go, there's no place to go, there's nothing." He also told us that the gangs that rule Haiti would target him and other TPS returnees, assuming they have money.

Pray for our leaders, everyone affected, and that Haiti can become a peaceful homeland. We know people everywhere need help and big decisions must be made. We remember the orphans' song, "Even when we cannot see, He will make a way for me"
